This draft PEIS addresses the direct and indirect effects of the proposed action – the introduction of a nonnative species, the Suminoe oyster, and continued efforts to restore the native Eastern oyster, and eight alternatives – on ecological, environmental and human issues. The estimated costs and potential consequences of the alternatives are also addressed.
