TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION FACILITIES

PART 1 GENERAL

1.1 SCOPE OF WORK

1.1.1 The Contractor shall furnish temporary construction facilities at the construction site according to the size and performance requirements specified herein. All costs for hookup and usage for telephone, electric and water shall be paid for by the contractor.

1.1.2 Facilities shall consist of the following:

- USACE Field Office
- Parking Area
- Outdoor Lighting

1.2 SUBMITTALS

In accordance with the requirements specified in SECTION 01330 - SUBMITTAL PROCEDURES, floor plans, proposed fixtures, materials of construction and proposed siting locations shall be submitted to, and shall require approval from the Contracting Officer prior to delivery to the site for erection. As a minimum, the following documents shall be submitted:

1.2.1 Temporary Site Facility Layout Plan; SD-04 Drawings; GA.

The Temporary Site Facility Layout Plan shall be submitted to the Contracting Officer at least 14 calendar days prior to the Pre-Work Conference.

1.2.2 Trailer's Floor Plan; SD-04 Drawings; GA.

1.2.3 Electrical Supply and Lighting Shop Drawings; SD-04 Drawings; GA.

1.2.4 Water Supply, Contaminated Washwater Handling and Sanitary Facilities; SD-18 Records; GA.

PART 2 PRODUCTS

2.1 General

2.1.1 All structures other than storage sheds installed under this section shall be provided with, as a minimum, the following services:

2.1.1.1 Lighting. Electric light, non-glare type luminaries to provide a minimum illumination level of 50 foot-candles at desk height level.

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2.1.1.2 Heating and Cooling. Adequate equipment to maintain an ambient air temperature of 70-degrees Fahrenheit (F)  $\pm$  3 degrees.

2.1.1.3 Potable bottled water.

2.2 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Field Office

2.2.1 The Contractor shall furnish at the job site, prior to the start of work, a 50 feet by 12 feet field office for the use by USACE representatives for the duration of the contract. Field office and contents will remain the property of the Contractor. The exact location will be designated by the Contracting Officer. The building shall be well constructed and properly ventilated and shall contain a closet, door and windows which shall be capable of being locked, four (4) chairs, one (1) plan rack and drawing board, two (2) desks, and one (2) two-drawer filing cabinet. Two of the chairs for use by government personnel should have ergonomic features: adjustable lumbar support, pneumatic seat height adjustment, adjustable arms, contoured front edge. The Contractor shall also provide adequate electric lighting, minimum 6 duplex electrical receptacles, drinking water, heat, plumbed toilet facilities, air conditioning, janitorial services and maintenance services. In addition the Contractor shall make arrangements and pay connection fees and monthly usage for electrical and 5-line telephone service, one dedicated to fax, two dedicated to modem and two dedicated to voice. The field office shall be removed from the project site when and as directed by the Contracting Officer.

### 3.1 LOCATION

The Contractor shall utilize the Contractor's Support Zone shown on the Contract Drawings for all temporary facilities. Use of areas outside the Contractor's Support Zone shall be pre-approved by the Contracting Officer.

### 3.2 MAINTENANCE

The Contractor shall maintain all temporary construction facilities and shall perform all necessary repairs, replacement, cleaning and any other maintenance required as directed by the Contracting Officer. Included in this maintenance shall be sweeping and any other cleaning necessary to keep the project vicinity area free of soil, dust and debris.
