


ENGELMANN'S ARROW-HEAD  
*Sagittaria Engelmanniana*

Located in shallow water, wet sand and peat throughout the Division. Also known as Arrow-leaf.

The leaves are narrowly lance-shaped or arrow-shaped, often with both shapes on the same plant; 3 to 20 cm long; basal lobes one-third to one-half the length of the leaf, narrow and gradually pointed. Flower stalk streaked with fine grooves and about as high as the leaves (25 to 80 cm), with 2 to 4 whorls of 3 flowers each; one whorl usually producing fruit the others with male flowers; stems of male flowers often twice the length of female. Flowers white, 3 petaled, 1 to 2.5 cm wide; blooming from July to October. Fruiting heads 1.2 to 2.3 cm in diameter; very prickly.
