

SPATULATE-LEAVED SUNDEW
Drosera intermedia

Located in acid bogs and wet sand in coastal areas throughout the Division.

Larger and more erect than *D. rotundifolia* and the leaves are oval rather than round. The leaf stalks do not have hairs, but the upper surface of the oval leaf is covered with hairs which secrete dew-like drops of sticky liquid which entrap insects. The flower stalk is 2 to 25 cm high and erect; 1 to 20 flowers. Flowers white; blooming from June through August. See also *D. filiformis* P. 40.01.
