- **B.** Typical year assessment(s): According to APT, on the date of the site visit, the area being reviewed is wetter than normal. This was observed with the first data point pit. Soils were non hydric, however the water table was at the surface during a time of year that the water table is typically below 24 inches from the surface.
- C. Additional comments to support AJD: Corps was asked to perform the Wetland Delineation. Standing water, Forested Wetland was found. Delineation was based on soils. Day of site visit was approximately 4 days after an extremely heavy and long duration rainfall. See APT data. In areas with non hydric soils, water table was present during the dry season. Delineated entire limits of wetland

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found. No surface connection found and the hydric soils within the depression are surrounded by non-hydric soils. Area is a depression in the landscape.

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
