Defense Supply Center Richmond
Restoration Advisory Board
Meeting Minutes
November 13, 2006

The meeting for the Defense Supply Center Richmond (DSCR) Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) was held at Bensley Community Building on November 13, 2006. The meeting began at 7:30 P.M. A quorum of members was present to conduct RAB transactions.

Opening Remarks

DSCR acting Facilitator, Adrienne Moore, opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m. Community Co-Chair, Janet Moe, began the meeting. Special guests in attendance included: Roy Shrove from Air Force Center of Environmental Excellence (AFCEE), and the new facilitation contractor, Zan Martin. Adrienne Moore previewed the evening's agenda and briefly discussed the items that would be covered during the meeting.

Cleanup Program Update

Adrienne Moore provided the program update which included updates on the following:

- Groundwater sampling for the OU-9 IRA test was conducted in October 06. The next round takes place in December 2006.
- Operable Unit 12: Soils impacted from Former Bldg. 112 Pesticide Operation. Construction is complete.
- Operable Unit 8: Groundwater impacted from former acid neutralization pits operation. The draft Record of Decision (ROD) was sent to the regulatory agencies. The agencies are reviewing the document. The media of concern is groundwater.
- Operable Unit 2: Soil impacted from former landfill. DSCR has developed responses to historical comments issued by EPA and VDEQ. Finalization of the Technical Memorandum on the Revised Remedy Selection is proceeding. The media of concern is soils.

- Operable Units 6 & 7: Baseline Human Health Risk Assessments are being completed. DSCR will submit these documents with the Feasibility Studies. Plans for the groundwater Pilot Test are being completed. The media of concern is groundwater.
- Operable Units 10 & 11: Soils impacted from pesticide storage. Finalized the Feasibility Studies for both OU's. Legal notice of the Proposed Plan Public Meeting was posted in the Village News and Times Dispatch. Comment period runs from Nov. 6th through Dec. 20th.
- Operable Unit 13: Soil impacted from past fuel oil release. DSCR is addressing comments from EPA/VDEQ regarding the Feasibility Study for OU-13.

Issues Log

Adrienne Moore led discussion of the issues log.

- Each open item in the Issues Log was discussed.
- The amount of groundwater that was pumped and treated through the OU 9 system was discussed. Apparently, the information provided was not detailed enough and thus, the matter was left "open" on the Issues Log.
- The DSCR installation tour remains on the Issues Log. The RAB selected January 13, 2007 for the tour date. Names of those participating on the tour will hopefully to be secured by the December 2006 RAB.
- The content for the next Community Newsletter was discussed. The issue remained open pending the research into why some of the members were not receiving the newsletter.
- The No Name Creek flooding issue was discussed with regards to a study which was performed in 2000. Discussion revolved around ways which the government and landowners could alleviate the Alcott Road problems. This issue remains open pending further review.

Public Forum

The meeting was opened for any comments or questions from the RAB or the public.

Technical Presentation: Briefing on AFCEE

Roy Shrove provided the RAB with a summary regarding the ways in which AFCEE provides support to DSCR and other DoD Agencies. AFCEE performs comprehensive contract management for DSCR's Installation Restoration Program. They perform various other kinds of technical and administrative support to other DoD entities (BRAC, Base Conversion etc.)

Public Comment

Mr. and Mrs. McCoy were recognized by Chesterfield County for outstanding work in the community.

Under the Issues Log, a DSCR contact name to whom Janet Moe can address her concerns regarding No Name Creek, will be added.

Administrative Items

A discussion was held regarding the reduction in RAB meetings. DSCR would like to reduce the frequency of the meetings to reflect the mature status of the cleanup program and the Board. The October motion to vote on the RAB reduction was tabled until November. However, it was determined by the RAB that a vote was needed on the issue of if there was to be six and only six meetings per year. Ms. Moe stated “First of all, we're voting on whether or not we're having six and only six meetings next year.” Mr. Beadles then replied “Then can we call for that question?” The vote went as follows: “All in favor? All opposed?” “The motion is defeated.”

Meeting Adjourned

- George Beadles made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Lonnie McCoy seconded the motion.
- The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
