Defense Supply Center Richmond
Restoration Advisory Board
Meeting Minutes
October 16, 2006

The meeting for the Defense Supply Center Richmond (DSCR) Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) was held at Bensley Community Building on October 16, 2006. The meeting began at 7:30 P.M. A quorum of members was present to conduct RAB transactions.

Attendees

Opening Remarks

DSCR Facilitator, Mark Leeper, opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m. Community Co-Chair, Janet Moe, began the meeting. Special guests in attendance included: Manish Joshi from Earth Tech Inc, and the new facilitation contractor, Zan Martin. Mark Leeper previewed the evening's agenda and briefly discussed the items that would be covered during the meeting.

Cleanup Program Update

Steven Edlavitch provided the program update which included updates on the following:

- The OU 9 IRA groundwater results, through July 2006, were discussed. Sampling was conducted in October 06.
- Operable Unit 12: Soils impacted from Former Bldg. 112 Pesticide Operation. The RAB was briefed on the cap installation. A discussion was had regarding the ecological enhancements and *bioswale* established at OU 12. Photos were shown documenting the progress of the site.
- Operable Unit 8: Groundwater impacted from former acid neutralization pits operation. The draft Record of Decision (ROD) was sent to the regulatory agencies. The agencies are reviewing the document. The media of concern is groundwater.
- Operable Unit 2: Soil impacted from former landfill. DSCR has developed responses to historical comments issued by EPA and VDEQ. Finalization of the Technical Memorandum on the Revised Remedy Selection is proceeding. The media of concern is soils.

- Operable Units 6 & 7: Baseline Human Health Risk Assessments are being completed. DSCR will submit these documents with the Feasibility Studies. Plans for the groundwater Pilot Test are being completed. The media of concern is groundwater.
- Operable Units 10 & 11: Soils impacted from pesticide storage. Finals of the Proposed Plans for both were sent to the agencies for review. Legal notice of the Proposed Plan Public Meeting should be in the November 5, 2006 *Times-Dispatch* newspaper.
- Operable Unit 13: Soil impacted from past fuel oil release. DSCR is addressing comments from EPA/VDEQ regarding the Feasibility Study for OU-13.

Issues Log

Adrienne Moore led discussion of the issues log.

- Each open item in the Issues Log was discussed.
- The OU 9 Interim Remedial Action (IRA) evaluation (Rebound Test) was discussed. DSCR briefed the RAB that a full year of groundwater data would be needed in order to assess the results of the test. A more detailed presentation was delivered soon after and the issue was closed.
- The DSCR installation tour remains on the Issues Log. Kim Turner provided the RAB with three possible dates: November 18, 2006, December 2, 2006, and January 13, 2007.
- The content for the next Community Newsletter was discussed. The issue remained open pending the research into why some of the members were not receiving the newsletter.
- Possible associations to join the RAB were discussed. This item was closed due to the lack of external interest.
- The No Name Creek flooding issue was discussed. Janet Moe asked to whom she should direct her questions to regarding flooding of Alcott Road. This issue remains open pending further review.

Public Forum

The meeting was opened for any comments or questions from the RAB or the public.

- George Beadles made a comment regarding the email that was sent out illustrating the 2007 RAB meeting schedule. This email was sent out, however, the attachment that has the 2007 RAB meetings was inadvertently excluded. It was agreed upon that the email should be sent out the following day.
- George Beadles brought up the point that two members of the RAB share a position and are listed on the roster as having two discrete votes. This issue was rectified as the roster will be amended to illustrate that the two members share one (1) vote.

Technical Presentation: Briefing on OU 6 & 9 IRA

Steve Edlavitch provided the RAB with a mid-way-point update regarding the IRA (OU 9 Pump & Treat Rebound Test) groundwater sampling results. The results from January, April, and July were discussed. Many questions were raised and answered regarding the results. One question was asked regarding the storm water that gets trapped in the vaults and how much water has been treated since January 06.

Public Comment

No comments were made during this period.

Administrative Items

The draft minutes for September 2006 were approved. George Beadles made a motion to approve as presented. Clarence Brooks seconded the motion. The motion was passed. A major discussion was held regarding the December 2006 RAB. After much consternation, it was decided by vote that the December 2006 RAB meeting will start at 6:30 and run until 7:30 at which time the Public Meeting for OUs 10 & 11 will take place. If necessary, the RAB will reconvene after the Public Meeting. Clarence Brooks made the motion and Josh Galloway seconded the motion. Janet Moe took a vote; three yes, zero No, and one abstention. The RAB meeting will be held at 6:30 to 7:30, then the public meeting, and if necessary, and continuation of the RAB meeting afterwards.

Meeting Adjourned

- George Beadles made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Josh Galloway seconded the motion.
- The meeting was adjourned at 9:25 p.m.
