



SEA-PINK  
*Sabatia stellaris*

VIMS

Located in saline or brackish marshes and meadows throughout the Division. Also known as Marsh-Pink and Rose of Plymouth.

An annual or biennial, erect herb with a shallow tap-root; stems are nearly round or slightly 4-angled in cross-section, unbranched or with alternate straight or forked branches; 30 to 50 cm high. The opposite leaves are narrow, lance-to-oblong- or spatula-shaped, stalkless, narrowing at both the base and the tip; 1.2 to 5 cm long. The pink 5-petaled flowers are numerous, each at the end of a branch or slender stalk; the yellow central eye is bordered with red or brown; blooming from July to October.
