



SEA OX-EYE
Borrichia frutescens

Located in salt and brackish marshes in Virginia and south. Often located in the higher parts of the marsh and in saltmeadows.

Branching perennial shrubs often found in dense stands arising from the creeping root system. Stems, stout, round in cross section with soft, fine, grayish hairs and few branches; 30 to 60 cm high. The opposite leaves are fleshy, oval, oblong or lance-shaped; attached directly to stem; 2 to 10 cm long, may be toothed near the base. Flower heads yellow, solitary, on the ends of branches, 3 cm broad; 15 to 25 short rays; blooming July through October. The burr-like seed heads, are dark brown and form in late autumn.
