

WHITE CEDAR
Chamaecyparis thyoides

Located in swamps, bogs, and salt and brackish marshes throughout the Division.

An evergreen tree reaching 25 m high. Leaves appear as scales on the twigs; pale green; strongly scented. Cone are small (6-9mm diameter), light blue, and globular in shape.

Wood of great economic importance because of its durability. Foliage browsed by small mammals and deer; seeds used by some song birds.
