



ROUND-LEAVED SUNDEW
Drosera rotundifolia

Located in bogs and wet sands throughout the Division
Also known as Dew-Plant or Eyebright.

Leaves of this perennial are short and roundish; forming a small cluster near the ground. The green disk at the end of the leaf stalk is covered with fine, reddish hairs which secrete dew-like drops of sticky liquid which entrap insects. The white to red flowers (similar to but smaller than *D. filiformis*, p. 40.01) are on a slender, erect stem 5 to 30 cm high. There may be 1 to 25 flowers per stalk which open one at a time in sunlight.

This delicate plant grows in among other low vegetation and may be easily overlooked.
