

GRASS-PINK  
*Calopogon pulchellus*

Located in sphagnum bogs, along wet shores and in swamps throughout the Division. Also known as Swamp-Pink.

This orchid ranges from 7 to 97 cm high with one long, narrow, pointed leaf forming a sheath around the base of the flowering stem. The flowering stem normally has 2 to 10 magenta to rose-pink or lilac blooms. In one form the flower is white rather than pink. The yellow-crested lip is at the top of the flower rather than the bottom as in *Pogonia ophioglossoides* (P. 42.10). Flowers bloom from June through August.
