LABRADOR TEA
Ledum gronlandicum

Located in bogs and swamps in eastern Pennsylvania, New York, Massachusetts and north.

A low, erect, branching, evergreen shrub; 1 m or less high. Leaves are alternate, thick, toothless, oblong or narrower with rounded tips and rolled edges; underside of leaves as well as twigs are brown-wooly; 2 to 5 cm long; fragrant when bruised. The flowers are small, white, 5-petaled in terminal clusters; blooming in May and June. The seed capsule is slender, oblong and nodding on a short stalk.
