The Virginia Department of Historic Resources (DHR) received on January 29, 2016 the updated tables provided by the Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) to the consulting parties that present the lists of identified archaeological and architectural resources within the project's area of potential effects and the Corps' effect determinations for individual historic properties. DHR has reviewed these updated tables and concurs with the Corps' determinations. As stated in our November 13, 2015 letter, we agree with the Corps that this project will result in an overall adverse effect to historic properties. The February 2, 2016 consulting parties meeting drew valuable input regarding studies that may be implemented to understand the full range and severity of effects.
